RESOLUTION NO. 20 - 272

AUTHORIZING SPECIFIC ALLOCATION OF CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act"), effective March 27, 2020, to provide economic relief to State, Local, and Tribal governments responding to the Coronavirus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on April 23, 2020, the County of Kane received approximately \$92,900,000 in CARES Act funding from the United States Department of the Treasury to defray costs associated with Coronavirus response within the County, which was placed in a Coronavirus Relief Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Kane County Board established the CARES Act Allocation Committee (CAAC) to study options for the best allocation of CARES Act funds and other future federal Coronavirus relief funds received by the County, and to make recommendations to the County Board for the use of those funds; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2020, the Kane County Board resolved that funds received by the County of Kane pursuant to the CARES Act shall be allocated under the following general allocation framework: 55% shall be allocated to the County of Kane and 45% shall be allocated to municipalities/units of local government, and of said funds allocated to municipalities and units of local government, 80% shall be made available for distribution through applications deemed eligible, with supporting documentation, and an intergovernmental agreement, said agreement being in a form acceptable to the Kane County State's Attorney; and

WHEREAS the CAAC has continued its review of the general allocation framework and made determinations of further specificity within the general allocation framework; and

WHEREAS the CAAC recommends to the County Board further specific allocations within the general allocation framework, said specific allocations being reflected in attached Exhibit A.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kane County Board adopts the specific allocations within the general allocation framework in the attached Exhibit A as determinative of its intent to distribute received CARES Act funds, and said funds shall be allocated as indicated in Exhibit A, with all future disbursements to municipalities or other local units of government, or other eligible applicants, subject to approval by the Kane County State's Attorney's Office, after applications deemed eligible, with supporting documentation, and intergovernmental agreement.
