Applications are now being accepted for the following initiatives:

Nourishing Lives: Kane County Food Access Initiatives

This funding is designed to improve access to nutritious food and tackle food insecurity, which has profound effects on both mental and physical health. The initiative seeks to create sustainable food access solutions that support healthier lifestyles and reduce the behavioral health impacts of food scarcity.

Kane County Transportation Assistance Program

This program provides funding for transportation solutions that improve access to essential services, including behavioral health care. By reducing transportation barriers, the initiative supports individuals in accessing the care and resources they need to thrive.

Strengthening Behavioral Health Through Meeting Basic Needs

By supporting projects that meet basic needs, KCHD aims to enhance the overall well-being and resilience of Kane County residents. Eligible expenditures include, but are not limited to, payments for medication, hearing aids, glasses, medical equipment, utility assistance, rent/deposit assistance, respite costs, legal aid, housing/property improvements for access and stability, costs associated with reliable transportation, filing vital paperwork, childcare, and medical visits.
