With the March 17th primary less than two weeks away, Kane County Clerk John A. Cunningham wants to assure voters that the election process is safe and secure.

Cunningham continues to strive to administer the elections with utmost accuracy, safety and accessibility for all voters and includes not only his office but also the involvement and collaboration of Kane County State’s Attorney, Jaime L. Mosser; Kane County Sheriff, Ron Hain; and Director of Office of Emergency Management, Scott Buziecki.

“There are adequate protections in place to ensure there is non-interference at all county polling places by anyone in violation of federal and state laws,” Cunningham said.

The County Clerk’s Office established protocols about five years ago to ensure the election process is accurate, safe, secure and accessible for all voters.

Anyone who witnesses any potential interferences is encouraged to call the Kane County State’s Attorney Complaint Hotline at 630-208-5328.

“We have taken all steps and have established programs to address situations by people who try to interfere with voting,” Cunningham said.

“Our Election Judges are Officers of the Court at polling places and they are fully informed to contact the Kane County Sheriff or call 911 if they see any irregularities,” Cunningham.

Interference with voting is prohibited under 18 U.S.C. § 245(b)(1)(A), titled “Federally Protected Activities,” according to a legal opinion issued by Kane County State’s Attorney Jamie Mosser.

Cunningham said many of his changes were implemented in 2005.

Cunningham has served as Kane County’s Clerk since 2002, demonstrating a commitment to serving the public with integrity. From modernizing the election system off the punch card, to improving voter access, to being recognized as one of the top 10 election authorities in the United States by the U.S. Alliance Group. These are just a few of his many accomplishments.
