





WHAT DO I GET FOR THAT?

- Every court case — from traffic tickets to human trafficking — is funded by Kane County taxes.
- Restaurants and food vendors are permitted and inspected for safe food handling.
- The Kane County Sheriff provides public safety throughout the county.
