



What is Project SEARCH?

Project SEARCH is a dedicated program focused on providing education and training to young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This is accomplished through an innovative workforce and career development model that benefits the individual, workplace, and community.

Our primary goal is to prepare each intern for competitive employment upon completion of this nine-month skill-building experience.

Project SEARCH has grown from one original program site at Cincinnati Children's Hospital in 1996, to over 500 host business sites across the United Stated and four countries.

Each program year, 10-12 selected interns participate in three different internship opportunities throughout the hospital. These opportunities include, but are not limited to, various clerical duties, hospitality, supply distribution, and equipment maintenance skills that are transferable within many industries.

Project SEARCH at Delnor Hospital is an **out-of-school** program geared towards young adults between the ages of 18 and 24.

What are the requirements to be a Project SEARCH student?

- Must be within eligible age range of 18-24
- Must have accepted their high school diploma
- Applicants need to have an open case with the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS) and support from their counselor
- Must have proof of disability
- Must have a desire to work competitively at the end of the program
- Would benefit from participation in a variety of skill-building internships
- Who are independent with self-care and medication management (if applicable)
- Who can self-monitor on a 1:4 ratio of support
- Who have access to independent transportation to/from Northwestern Medicine Delnor Hospital

Application for the 2023-2024:

Application opens January 2nd, 2023

Completed applicants are due on or before: April 2023

Applicant interviews: June 2023

Applicants notified of selection: July 2023

If selected, candidates must be able to pass a criminal background check, medical evaluation and drug screen.

To further enhance an intern's total immersion in the workplace, there is an onsite learning center at Northwestern Medicine Delnor Hospital that accommodates the selected 10-12 interns, an employability instructor and skills trainers (provided by our supported employment agency – Parents Alliance Employment Project) during the academic school year.

• 9:00 am-2:00 pm Worksite Internship (includes lunch)

• 2:00 pm Return to the classroom, review day and tomorrow's plan

• 2:15 pm Depart

Project SEARCH is driven by a collaboration with the following community partners all focused on providing employment opportunities to individuals with disabilities:

- Project SEARCH interns will receive certification of completion from Waubonsee Community College after each internship.
- Project SEARCH receives funding for the program from the Kane County Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)
- Project SEARCH graduates receive effective follow-along services to gain and retain employment after they complete this last transition year.
- Our goal is for 100% of our interns to achieve employment within our community.
